### Why Pursue an MHA?

Physicians are increasingly assuming significant leadership and administrative roles across the healthcare industry. Earning a masters degree in healthcare administration together with the Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree will greatly expand your understanding of the business of medicine and further your preparation to assume important leadership positions now and in the future.

### **Program Goals**

The DO-MHA program at Idaho State will provide ICOM student doctors with foundational conceptual, technical, and human relations skills that emphasize communication and relationship management, leadership, professionalism, knowledge of the healthcare environment, and business knowledge and related skills.

#### Curriculum
