Why Pursue an MPH?

The goal of public health is to improve the health of populations through the planning, implementing, and evaluating public health programs that promote health, and prevent disease and injury. Public health professionals utilize a combination of social, environmental, legislative, and economic support to improve health programs designed to create a healthier populace.

Program Goals

ICOM students who combine an MPH with their professional medical degree will gain additional competencies to advance their career and increase their ability to improve health outcomes.

The program courses have a community health emphasis and include an acquisition of requisite public health knowledge and skills in a variety of areas.

Curriculum

ICOM students can expect to take 30 credits in total for the Master of Public Health program.
